## PRESIDENTOFFERS

 TO FORGET THE PAST Will Forgive all Filipinos Who Sut-render-General MacAarthur TodayIssued a Proclamation Offering An nesty and Immunity to the Fightin Filipinos.
 "Manila, June 21.-By declaration the president of the United Statee, the undersigned announces anneety, with
compiete immunity for the past and absocomplete immonytior for the fund abso all persone whonow or have since Feb-
ruary 4 , 1899, been in insurrection rasty
against the United States in either a
military or military or civil capacity, and who shall,
within a period ninety, days from the date bereof, formaily renaonee all con-
nection with such insurrection, and sub. scribe to a declaration acknowledging
and accepting the soverignty and
authority of the United Statea in and over the Philippine itlande.
"The privilige herevith published
extended to ull concerned, without extended to all concerned, without any reservation whatever, excepting that
persons who have violated the rules of war during the period of active hostilities are not embraced within the feope of
this amnesty. All who deeire to take adthis amnesty. All who denire to take ad-
vantage of the terms berewith eet for vantage of the terme berewith ret forth
are requested to present themselves to the are requested to present themselves to the
