PRESIDENTOFFERS **TO FORGET THE PAST**

Will Forgive all Filipinos Who Surrender-General MacAarthur Today Issued a Proclamation Offering Annesty and Immunity to the Fighting Filipinos.

WASHINGTON, June 21 .- The war department has made public the following notice of amnesty, which was issued by General MacArthur today at Manila :

"Manila, June 21 .- By declaration of the president of the United States, the undersigned announces amnesty, with complete immunity for the past and absolute liberty of action for the future, to all persons who now or have since February 4, 1899, been in insurrection against the United States in either a military or civil capacity, and who shall, within a period ninety days from the date hereof, formally renounce all connection with such insurrection, and subscribe to a declaration acknowledging and accepting the sovereignty and authority of the United States in and over the Philippine Islands. "The privilege herewith published is

extended to all concerned, without any reservation whatever, excepting that persons who have violated the rules of war during the period of active hostilities are not embraced within the scope of this amnesty. In order to mitigate as much as possible the consequences resulting from the various disturbances which since 1896, have succeeded each other so rapidly, and to provide in some measure for destitute soldiere during the transltory period which must inevitably succeed peace, the military authorities of the United States will pay 30 pesotos to each man who presents a rifle in good condition.
