LITERALLY RUNNING WITH BLOOD

There is No Hope for the Foreigners and All Foreign Consuls Have Cabled that Disturbances Are Spreading.

LONDON, July 6.—There is a mass of rumor from the far East. Though contradictory on most points, it continues unanimous as to the consumption of the tragedy at Peking.

Consistent reports of the whites are added the additional horrors of savage soldiery butchered at the 5000 natives, Roman Catholic priests. This comes on a Shanghai dispatch of July 5, which only adds to the report given by respectable Chinese who have arrived from Chai-Fu, and who describe Peking as an inferno, the streets literally running with blood.

They confirm numerous stories of mutilations and untold tortures inflicted on isolated foreigners and European officers captured by the mob. The authority of Yang Lu, the Chinese Imperial Treasurer, who advocated extermination, was completely effaced by the Tuan Kang Yi and Tung Fuh, who issued fresh edicts ordering the merciless extermination of all foreigners in the empire.

WASHINGTON, July 6.—A dispatch has been received at the state department from Consul-General Goodnow at Shanghai, dated July 5, in which he says the situation is serious and the insurrectionary movement is spreading. If the allied forces, he said, should meet and reverse the insurrection will certainly spread to central and southern China resulting in the expulsion and murder of foreigners in the interior and the ruin of trade. A strong force, he says, is necessary to check the viceroy in the north and to support the viceroy in the south.

It is understood that all consuls of the powers in China have sent identical dispatches to their respective governments.

LONDON, July 6.—In response to inquiries cabled to Shanghai in regard to the situation at Peking, the following telegram has been received from an authoritative quarter.

Shanghai, Thursday, July 5.—Prepare to hear the worst.

LONDON, July 6.—The danger of a general revolt in China becomes more and more patent, and Europe is being confronted with rapidly increasing force with the fact that not merely the international column may be forced from the Tien, but that the international troops of colonies and treaty ports will stand in grave danger of expulsion. In view of the fact that the previous assurances of the viceroy have proved unworthy, their promises of protection for the whites are hardly convincing.

HILL DECLINED THE HONOR

Most Remarkable Scene Ever Witnessed on a Convention Floor—Bryan Took Part in Fracas Over a Long Distance Telephone.

KANSAS CITY, July 6.—Bryan was kept busy all last night receiving congratulations on his nomination. They came by telephone, telegraph and special messenger.

After a talk over the wire with Senator Jones at 11 o'clock this morning, Bryan decided not to go to Kansas City.

David B. Hill this morning stated that he did not want the nomination for vice-president, and would not accept it. He predicted that Adlai Stevenson would be nominated.

Grady, of New York, said: "He may decline the nomination, but decline or not, New York's vote to the end of the convention will be for David B. Hill."

The leaders of the movement against Hill said they would adjourn the convention before they will allow his nomination to be made, in order to allow Mr. Bryan's wishes to be known to the delegates.

This convention was called to order at 10:45, and nominations for vice-president were called for at once.

Arkansas yielded to Illinois, who nominated Adlai E. Stevenson.

About this time cries for Hill and it was made known that New York intended to present his name.

At 12 o'clock, Grady, of New York, took the platform to name Hill. Hill quickly followed, the convention meanwhile becoming tempestuous and chaotic with happiness over the prospects of Hill's nomination.

Intermingled with Grady's words in nominating Hill, were frequent bursts of "I won't accept" from David Bennett and "Yes you will" from the convention. Pandemonium reigned.

About this time messages were flying thick and fast between Kansas City and Lincoln and it soon became known that Bryan was protesting against the prospective Hill stampede. He wanted some other man.

Hill appealed to Chairman Jones for help and was finally allowed to make a speech positively declining the honor.

Charles A. Towne, J. Ham Lewis and others were nominated and Mr. Lewis withdrew.

At 2:44, Adlai E. Stevenson was nominated on the first ballot with 558½ votes.

Then came a rush to get in the band wagon, and New York was foremost in the scramble.

At 3:21 the convention adjourned sine die.
