Again, if after the destruction of the Spanish fleet he had considered the fruits of victory complete, and had steamed out of the barbor and left the city of Manila, with its 200,000 inhabitants,-many of whom were Europeans-to its fate, what would have been the result? Weakened by the loss of the Spanish ships, the city would have been an easy prey to the 30,000 revengeful Filipinos-goaded to desperation by Spanish cruelty-outside the walls, and a massacre of Germans, English and Spaniards would have been an event that would have "staggered humanity." It was absolutely necesssary for Dewey to remain within shooting distance to protect the life and property of foreign residents. Even after we had taken possession of the city, if the blood-thirsty Filipinos were allowed to wreak their vengeance upon the inhabitants, the streets of the city would have run blood, and we should have had a fearful account to settle with Germany, England, France, and even Spain. If we had left the arrogant Aguinaldo and his soldiers to work their own sweet will in their premeditated attack on our troops, on that night in February, Luzon island would have been a slaughter pen and Manila the bloodiest spot of all. 
