"M'KINLEY IMPERIALISM."

The peculiar nature of "McKinley imperialism," in its relation to the government of the Filipinos, has no better illustration than that afforded by the president's instructions to the Taft commission as given in Me-Kinley's letter of acceptance. It shows in clear light the wanton recklessness of the charges of the antis that the administration's objects are imperial aggression and the enslavement of the islanders. This, in part, is what the president enjoined:

No person shall be deprived of life, liberty or property without due process of law.

Private property shall not be taken for public use without just compensation.
