"M'KINLEY IMPERIALISM."

The peculiar nature of "McKinley imperialism," in its relation to the government of the Philippines, has no better illustration than that afforded by the president's instructions to the Taft commission as given in McKinley's letter of acceptance.

No person shall be deprived of life, liberty or property without due process of law.

Private property shall not be taken for public use without just compensation.

In all criminal prosecutions the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial, to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation, to be confronted with the witnesses against him, to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor, and to have assistance of counsel for his defense.

Excessive bail shall not be required, nor excessive fines imposed, nor cruel and unusual punishment inflicted.

No person shall be put twice in jeopardy for the same offense, or be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself.

The right to security against unreasonable searches and seizures shall not be violated.

Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude shall exist, except as a punishment for crime.

No bill of attainder or ex-post-facto law shall be passed.

No law shall be passed abridging the freedom of speech or of the press, or of the rights of the people to peaceably assemble and petition the government for a redress of grievances.

No law shall be made respecting the establishment of religion or prohibiting the free exercise thereof, and the free exercise and enjoyment of religious profession and worship, without discrimination or preference, shall forever be allowed.
