Japanese Will Not Retire.
London, Sept. 11, A. M.—Lord Salisbury will return to London Friday, when some fresh developments in the Chinese situation are expected.

Beyond Japan's reply, showing her intention to continue to occupy Peking, there is little to throw further light.

From Shanghai comes a report that Li Hong Chang has dispatched an urgent telegram to the empress dowager at Tai Yuan Fu, announcing the purpose of the allies to advance to Pao Ting Fu, and perhaps even further.

The Tsien Tsin correspondent of the Standard asserts that everyone in Peking is living on "bulter beef" and hard tack.
