GALVESTON AND POMPEH.

For centuries history and romance have dwelt upon the destruction of Pompeli as one of the world's most stupendous tragedies. But that calamity has been exceeded in the Galveston catastrophe in the opinion of the Spokesman-Review. The population of Pompeii at the time of its destruction has been estimated all the way from 12,000 to 50,000, with the weight of authority inclining toward the smaller estimate. In all probability the city was less than half as large as Galveston, and since all reports agree that half the property values of the Texas city have been obliterated, the material loss there will equal to the material loss
