**DANGEROUS TO GET ANGRY.**

**Paroxysms Have Frequently Resulted in Death or Mortal Injury.**

A study of anger from experiences in about 2,000 cases, collected from reliable observers, has been made by G. Stanley Hall. The causes were many and various, and often being trivial, and the physical sensations accompanying it differed greatly with the individual, says Stray Stories.

Flushing was very general, although pallor was a characteristic in 27 per cent. of the cases. The heart beats were violent, several cases of death from rupture of this organ being reported, and there were sometimes peculiar sensations in mouth and throat, sometimes dimness or blindness, frequently tears, and generally copious salivation, which might produce frothing at the mouth.

Common sounds were animal-like cries in children, and onths and threats in adults, while in many cases the throat was paralyzed and there was inability to speak above a whisper, or without crying or trembling. Biting with the head, biting and scratching are noticeable in childish anger.
