NEW YORK, Sept 27 .- A dispatch to the Herald from Shanghal says: The situation in China is now more serious free. than ever before for those who are interested in preserving the integrity of the empire. The Chinese government is in the power of Boxer leaders who are not likely to submit to the Emprese Dowager any proposition unfavorable to them. The friendly viceroys of the south are still loyal to the throne and any foreign aggression in Southern China will precipitate an armed uprising.

Already the governor of Nganhwei province has addressed a memorial to the Emperes Dowager, declaring that his signature to the viceroy's agreement with the foreign consuls in Shanghai was forged.
