Nautical Miles and Knots.
Nautical miles and knots are again in a state of confusion. This is the natural result of the shattering of the maiden record by the steamer Deutschland. We are told that she steamed 3,044 knots, when, as a matter of fact, she traversed that number of nautical miles. A nautical mile is not a knot. The latter is the mark put on a log line to show the rate of speed, at which the vessel is proceeding. When a certain number of knots run out on the line in 28 seconds it demonstrates that the vessel is making that many miles an hour. The knot is proportional to the mile, but it is not a mile. It is 1/60 of a mile. No sailor man would speak of a vessel traveling so many knots, though he would speak of her going at the rate of so many knots an hour. This is one of the little things that betray the difference between the seaman and the landsman.—N. Y. Times.
