York to a Washington Star writer the other day, "Indeed, as far as shape, size, pungency and good keeping qualities are concerned the California product has within the past four years become a dangerous rival of the best Italian and Spanish fruit. The annual consumption of lemons in the United States amounts to about 5.ban.boo boxes. In 1896 Italy and Spain supplied us with 4,700,000 boxes of lemons and 300,000 boxes were grown in California. Last year therewere imported from Mediterraneau countries 2,800,000 baxes of lemons and 1.200, 30 boxes of the fruit came from the Pacific coast. This year the importation of lemons will be considerably smaller than ever before, and, providing the present high standard of the Unlifornia fruit is maintalmid, the growers of the state will in the course of a dew sensons succord in driving the Mediterranean lemons from our markets, just as they have driven out the foreign prones and raisins.

"While lemons have been grown in southern California for over a hunared years, the cultivation of the fruit as a commercial industry dates only from 1882. In that year the first grove was started on a large scale at Riverside with the intention of producing fruit to compete in the enstern markets with that imported from Italy and Spain. The zeal for demon growing soon spread to Po- be procured at Clarke & Falk's. mona valley, to Sauta Barbara, Ventura. Ontarlo and Pasadena, where the growers, in trying to make the cultivation of the fruit a profitable industry, met with a great many discourngements and failures for the first half dozen years.

"The trees grew and hore some excellent fruit, but while it was found that a shapely, thin-skinned and juicy lemon could be produced on the trees. it was found a difficult task to cure the fruit so that it would not only not not and show biemishes, but would retain its pungency and oiliness of peel, as well as its full acid juiciness. from the picking senson in winter until the following summer, when it was wanted by the consumer.

"The art of caring lemons was only properly learned by the Californians 3.97, when the principal lemon growers clubbed together and sent experts over to Italy and Spain to producing excellent results. To make the lemons sour they are picked before they begin to turn yellow. The fruit is then put in a curing house. where it is kept at a temperature of about 50 degrees for some 20 days. which 'sweats out' all the sugar. It is then removed to another tempernture for 60 days more before it is ready for the market. Thus the highest degree of acid and the largest degree of juice is obtained. One of the curious effects of this 'sweating process is to reduce the thickness of the skin. It originally grows thick and tough, but the neid seems to eat it up. Rough estimates put the capital invested in California in growing and curing lemons with all the apportenances at \$4,500,000.

"The person whose knowledge of lemons is limited to an occasional purchase of a dozen will be surprised to learn that there are 17 distinct varieties grown in California and Fiorida. These differ in size, shape, quality and skin and in keeping qualities: But there are only four varieties that have any popularity in California and in eastern markets. These are the Eureks, Lisbon, Villa France and Bonnie Brae."
