Tell-Tale Shoes Worn by a Man in a Party Searching for a Murderer.

On the night of the murder, necording to his story, he had noticed the brogans on the porch of the farmhouse and appropriated them, intending at the time to merely rob the store and fig the country After killing the storekeeper he changed his plans and came home, thinking to divert suspicion by remaining quietly at work. Consequently he returne the shoes where he found them.

"After he had made this confession the farmer told his own story and produced the tell-tale footgear. Heaven only knows what might have happened had he been caught with them on his feet the first day of the search."




