WHY WHEAT IS LOW.

Washington wheat is selling on the Liverpool market around 90 cents per bushel. The price in the Palouse and Big Bend country chings close to 40 cents. Therefore 50 cents of the Liverpool price goes to the railroad, the ocean carrier and the middlemen, says the Spokesman-Review.

This is abnormally high toll, and accounts, in part, for the ruling low price of wheat in this section. The Oregonian prints a table, giving the Portland price of wheat since 1890:




