On February 3, 1900, the land officials of the Lakeview Land Office rendered a decision in favor of the settlers who had and for which they have been in controversy ever since.

It was contended by the settlers that while land for which the state of Oregon had granted a title to McConnahey Bros. (afterwards embodied in the incorporation which formed the Warner Valley Stock Company) as swamp land, and which could not be such according to their testimony, was covered by the waters of a permanent lake in the year 1860. The case was appealed from the Lakeview Land Office decision, and after going into the testimony Commissioner Hermann decided that the land was not covered by the waters of a permanent iske as stated by witnesses for the settlers in the case before the Lakeview Land decision is final and will take the homes from many families kept poor by the constant expense of land suits since their settlement in Warner.

Colonel C. A. 
