

PEOPLE COMING AND GOING.

Driver went to Portland this morning on legal business. R. G. Sigman, a prominent farmer of the Dufur neighborhood, was in town today. Mayor M. J. Anderson, Henry Johnston and W. V. Crafts were in town last night from Dufur. Mr. Wilton Freeman, who has been ill with typhoid fever, left on the boat this morning for California, where he expects to regain his health.

Coroner's Inquest.

Coroner Butts held an inquest this morning on the remains of the man that was killed on the railroad track between Hood River and Mosier Sunday evening. Four witnesses were examined, three of them being the trainmen, who were the only witnesses of the accident, and William Mitchell, of this city, who testified as to the condition in which he found the fragments of the man's body, the details of which are too utterly horrible to put in print. There was no evidence to show that ever the deceased had lived in The Dalles, as was reported yesterday through a mistaken identity. The following is the verdict:

We the jury impaneled by W. H. Butts, coroner of Wasco county, Oregon, to inquire into the death of the body now before us, after investigating the facts produced before us, come to the following conclusions:

That the name of the deceased was John Wilson, whose age was about 50 years, and whose home was at Helena, Montana, where he leaves a wife. That the said John Wilson came to his death at the hour of 5:45 o'clock p. m. Sunday, December 2, 1900, at mile post No. 68 on the O. R. & N. Co.'s railroad, which is about two miles east of Hood River, in the county of Wasco and state of Oregon.

That the said John Wilson, then and there, while in an intoxicated condition, lay or fell across the north rail of said track and was run over the middle of his body by freight train No. 23 and instantly killed.

That the place where said John Wilson was run over and killed was at a curve of said track, and for this reason the trainmen were unable to see the deceased in time to stop the train before it reached the deceased, and this jury for said reason does not attach any blame to said trainmen for said death.
