## VIEW OF RELATIONS OF MANKIND

Five Cardinal Points Submitted by Minister Wu—Address by the Plenipotentiary of the Celestial Empire to the Contemporary Club of Philadelphia.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 12.—The galleries of the Art Club were crowded last night by invited guests of the Contemporary club to hear Minister Wu deliver an address entitled, "The Chinese View." He was cordially received. In his address Mr. Wu dealt upon the five cardinal relations of mankind as seen by the Chinese nation. He drew many interesting as well as amusing comparisons between the customs of his own and of the American people. After speaking of the great age of the Chinese nation, Minister Wu said:

"Let us inquire into the cause, or rather combination of causes, namely the five cardinal relations of mankind. That is to say, first, between sovereign ministers and subjects; second, between parent and child; third, between elder and younger or between superior and inferior; fourth, the husband and wife, and last but not least, friend and friend. In the first case the attribute is benevolence on the part of the sovereign and respect on the part of the subject. In the second relation the parent must be kind and the child obedient. Between the elder and the younger there must be respect on the part of the latter. Concerning the fourth relation, righteousness is the husband's attribute, while submission is the duty of the wife. The duty of friends is to be faithful and truthful."

The speaker expanded on each of the five relations, giving the result of their application in China, and his view of corresponding returns in America. He spoke particularly of the second relation, saying that in America it was customary for the son to sit in the presence of the father.

"If my son should sit in my presence," jocularly declared the minister, "I would punch his head."

In conclusion Mr. Wu said:

"Although our civil association is not

perfect, yet it has stood the test of years well and the nation still exists. Of course in many respects the customs and manners of your country and my country are different, but there are good points in each. I think if each of us could learn the others' good points and profit by them it would be well. We must understand each other better, for much of the present trouble has arisen from misunderstanding. What you think is right we may think wrong. Therefore it is important that we judge not from our standpoint, but from the other point of view. In our country we are guided by duty; in yours, love is the guiding principle. I think we would be more happy if we could strike a medium."

### Against Landlordism.

DUBLIN, Dec. 12.—The Nationalist convention resumed its sessions today, John Redmond presiding. After resolutions had been adopted amending the constitution of the United States Irish League and making the Nationalist convention an annual fixture, William O'Brien moved a strongly-worded resolution in favor of the abolition of landlordism in Ireland and the transfer of the soil to the occupying proprietary. Ireland's struggle, he declared, should continue without ceasing until the landlords were forced to abandon their present intolerable system of dual control. One branch of the Irish League, continued Mr. O'Brien, will devote its time to bringing to the doors of landlords, landgrabbers and their castle allies the inconvenience of landlordism. The resolution was adopted amid the utmost enthusiasm.

### Threatens the Life of the President.

NEW YORK, Dec. 12.—The Herald says that 500 anarchists vociferously applauded last night at a meeting on behalf of the family of Bresci, the assassin, when one of their speakers threatened the life of President McKinley, "should he attempt to interfere with free speech." The speaker was Alexander Horr, who announced his approval of assassination. The anarchists met in Everett hall, East Fourth street. They had obtained the hall by a ruse which Henry Bimberg, the proprietor, resented last night.

Emma Goldman went to Bimberg and offered to hire the hall, alleging that it was wanted for a meeting of the "Social Science Club." Bimberg did not recognize her and consented to accommodate the club. John N. Cook had vigorously denounced the government, when Bimberg asked leave to speak. He declared the hall had been obtained under false pretenses.

"If I hear any incendiary speeches, I shall have to have the lights turned out," he added.

"Sit down! Sit down! Capitalists! Do you want to interrupt free speech?" yelled the audience.

Bimberg sat down and Alexander Horr arose and went on to say that society believed in government by the bayonet and that Jefferson was an anarchist.

"If I were in Russia today," said he, "I would be an assassin. If any one in control of government here persists in prohibiting the right of free speech, if the mayor of the city does it, or the governor of the state, or the president of the United States, he does it at his peril."

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12.—In connection with its consideration of the army reorganization bill, the senate committee on military affairs today listened to an argument by Adjutant-General Corbin for the continuation of the present canteen system in the army. The committee has taken no formal vote on the subject, but that there has been more or less exchange of opinion among members, the result of which has been favorable to the retention of the present system and the elimination of the house canteen provision. The committee expects to conclude its hearings on the bill tomorrow.
