**LONDON, Dec. 31.**—The war office has received the following dispatch from Lord Kitchener:  
 "Pretoria, Dec. 30, 7 p. m.—General Lytton reports that the outpost at Helvetia was captured yesterday morning by the Boers. About fifty were killed and taken prisoners.  
 "Colonel Kitchener reports that he is following with a small force in the track of the enemy, Helvetia being recaptured by Reeves, who has been reinforced from Belfast. Helvetia was a very strong position on the Mchadadorp-Lydenburg Railway, and was held by a detachment of the Liverpool regiment. Am asking for further information."
