How to Train the Children—Keep Them, Too Busy to Be on the Street.

It seems to me that if parents were to instill into the minds of their children the idea of making something of their lives; to have some object in view in the far future and to work toward attaining success of the object, turning all their faculties in the one direction, not dividing the forces which Nature gave them, that there would be better boys and girls. A boy or girl who does not know what they want to make of their lives are like ships at sea, without sails or rudder—a "helmsless vessel." Parents can generally tell accurately enough for what their children are by nature fitted, and 'tis right that the parents have the child trained to do the work for which they are fitted. It may be rude work, but practice makes perfect. Give a child something to work at that he likes; keep him busy and you will keep him good. If he is handy with carpenter tools, get him a few tools and some lumber and let him work. Two boys I know built a little house near their home. It is a rude affair, but what a pride they take in "our house." One day not long since I "peeped" in at the little window and I saw a camp stove in the house walled round with brick to prevent burning the walls of the house; a tiny table in one corner; some camp chairs neatly folded in a rack on the rafters; a shelf on which were several books. I noticed the names of the books, which were "Beautiful Joe" the story of a dog; "Black Beauty," the story of a horse; Greek Mythology; "Heroes of History"; "Child's Bible"; "American History"; "Robinson Crusoe," and "Grimm's Fairy Tales." Now, I do not believe those boys will ever go far wrong. The parents have trained their minds to be busy, to read, and to read good books. These little fellows placed pretty colored prints on the walls, thus showing a desire to "decorate" their home. No cigarette pictures, the youth of our land too often indulge in, but pretty bits of country life, a few sheep in a lane, and some chickens in a barn yard, which reminded them of "out to gramma's," a picture of a dog, which "looks like Bill, don't he, mamma?" and several cards their teachers gave them.
