

PEOPLE COMING AND GOING.

M. T. Nolan went to Portland on the afternoon train. Justice Brownhill went on a visit to Grass Valley this afternoon. Mrs. Hugh Logan left this afternoon on a short visit with friends in Portland. State Senators T. H. Johnston and J. N. Williamson left on the afternoon train for Salem. P. Welch, of the firm of Foley Bros. & Larsen, contractors, on the railroad improvements near Mosier, is in the city. Mrs. Charles Hanson, who has been seriously ill for the past couple of weeks, was taken to St. Vincent hospital this afternoon.

A Dalles-Celilo State Portage.

State Senators T. H. Johnston and J. N. Williamson made a trip this forenoon, in company with Frank Senfert, over the right of way that the government recently acquired for the now abandoned project of a boat railway. They were agreeably surprised to find that only about eight miles of portage railroad would be required to connect the navigable waters above Celilo with those below the Dalles rapids, and that five of the eight miles are almost level earth, requiring very little grading and no deep cuts. The remaining three miles are over rough and uneven rocks, over which a road could probably be best built by trestle work, as was the first road over similar rocks by the O. R. & N. Company.

Messrs. Johnston and Williamson agree with Mr. Senfert that the eight miles of road could be built for \$12,000 a mile. They believe that the five miles of earth could be graded for \$4,000 to \$5,000 a mile and that a fully equipped road, ready for business, should not cost much over \$150,000, or possibly \$175,000 at the farthest. These gentlemen will earnestly support an appropriation by the state for a portage road if they find that the people of Eastern Oregon, their constituents, so desire. But to equip them for the intelligent advocacy of this measure in the legislature a survey of the route ought to be made by competent parties and careful estimates made of the cost of construction and equipment.

This is a matter in which the Dalles business men would doubtless help but should not be expected to do it all, as their interest in the matter is very small compared with that of the inhabitants of the vast territory lying east of Celilo.

Joint Installation.

Tuesday evening Mt. Hood Camp, Woodmen of the World, and Cedar Circle, Women of Woodcraft, held joint installation.

A first-part program, consisting of a solo by Miss Maie Cushing and an address from the pen of John P. Meskin, the Woodmen of the World evangelist, was read by Mrs. Filloon, then the opening ode of Mt. Hood Camp was sung by members and the entire audience, and officers of Woodmen were installed by James Taylor. The captain of the guards not being able to attend, the guard movements were dispensed with.

The second-part program consisted of a solo by H. Parkins, who was encored to the echo; then the little Misses Dawson rendered a duet that was enjoyed by all and they responded to an encore. The Circle installed its officers to guard movements, with Miss Minnie Gosser as captain and Louise Rintoul as installing officer.

Refreshments were served and a nut-cracking contest resulted in Mrs. Nielsen receiving ladies' prize and Mr. Fred Burchdorf gentlemen's. Dancing was called for and Mr. Comini and Miss Maie Cushing furnished music, while all enjoyed dancing.

The hall was filled, every chair being occupied. Several visiting neighbors of both orders were present, and a general good, sociable, fraternal time was enjoyed by all. Midnight was reached before the crowd dispersed.
