THE DEATH OF QUEEN VICTORIA

Breathed Her Last at 6:30 p. m. Yesterday Surrounded By Her Children and Grandchildren—Albert, Prince of Wales is Hailed as King.

OSBORNE HOUSE, Cowes, Isle of Wight, Jan. 22 (6:30 p. m.)—The Queen has just breathed her last. She died surrounded by her children and grandchildren. Her death was painless and was so quiet that the group around the bed scarcely knew when the Queen stopped breathing. It became evident before 4 o'clock in the afternoon that she was sinking. Her breath became shorter and the pulse feeble. The medical attendants gave warning that death was near. The bishop of Winchester and the rector of Whippingham read prayers for those in extremis. The Queen is said to have bade farewell in a feeble monosyllable to her family, assembled at her bedside at mid-day. She first recognized the Prince of Wales, to whom she spoke a few words of great moment; then Emperor William and the others present filed past and heard a whispered good-bye. All those in the bedroom were in tears. Albert Edward is hailed as King.

News Conveyed to President McKinley. WASHINGTON, Jan. 22.—Secretary Hay, upon being assured through the physicians' certificate, as furnished him by the associated press, of the demise of Queen Victoria, promptly cabled the following message to Ambassador Choate at London:

"Choate, London: You will express to Lord Lansdowne the profound sorrow of the government and people of the United States at the death of the queen, and deep sympathy we feel with the people of the British empire in their affliction."

The flag on the executive mansion was placed at half mast at 3:30 o'clock this afternoon. So far as any record goes, this is the first time in the history of this country that this mark of respect has been paid to the memory of a foreign ruler.

President McKinley has sent the following message of condolence to King

Edward VII: "His Majesty, the King, Osborne House, Isle of Wight: "I have received with profound sorrow the lamentable tidings of the death of Her Majesty, the Queen. Allow me, sir, to offer my sincere sympathy and that of the American people in your personal bereavement and in the loss England has suffered in the death of this venerable and illustrious sovereign, whose noble life and beneficent influence have promoted the peace and affection of the world."

Senate Deplores Death of the Queen. WASHINGTON, Jan. 22.—In the senate this afternoon Mr. Allison, of Iowa, offered the following resolution, which was adopted unanimously: "That the death of Her Royal and Imperial Majesty, Victoria, of noble virtues and great renown, is sincerely deplored by the senate of the United States of America."

A Mark of Respect. WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 22.—The house today adopted a resolution expressing profound regret and sympathy with the English people, owing to the death of Queen Victoria. The president was requested to express the sentiment to Great Britain, and, as a further mark of respect, the house adjourned. The action of the house was particularly expressive, in that the resolution was adopted without dissent. It followed precedents and was in almost identically the same language of the resolutions adopted upon the occasion of the death of the president of the French republic and the czar.

The announcement of the death of Queen Victoria, conveyed unofficially to the senate, was recognized by that body in the adoption of an appropriate resolution which was ordered to be engrossed and forwarded to the prime minister of Great Britain. During the sitting of the senate in open session the legislative, executive and judicial appropriation bill was reported, so far as the committee amendments were concerned. It is now subject to amendment by individual senators. Little other business of importance was transacted.

THE DOINGS AT SALEM

Details of Yesterday's Vote and Report of Some Important Bills introduced.

SALEM, Jan. 22.—The legislature balloted in separate session at noon today for United States senator to succeed George W. McBride. There was no election. The two houses will meet in joint session tomorrow and continue to cast at least one vote a day until a senator is chosen.

NEW BOARD OF EQUALIZATION. Representative Roberts, of Wasco, has introduced a bill providing for a new kind of a state board of equalization. The board is to be composed of seven members, to be appointed by the governor, according to districts. The state is divided into districts for the purposes of the bill as follows:

First district—Wallowa, Union, Umatilla, Baker and Malheur counties, one member.

Second district—Wasco, Sherman, Gilliam, Wheeler, Crook, Lake, Klamath, Morrow, Grant, Harney and Jackson counties, one member.

Third district—Clatsop, Columbia, Washington, Clackamas, and Yamhill counties, one member.

Fourth district—Multnomah county, members.

Fifth district—Tillamook, Marion, Polk and Linn counties, one member.

Sixth district—Lincoln, Benton, Lane, Douglas, Coos, Curry, and Josephine counties, one member.

Three of the members shall be appointed for a term of two years, and four for a term of four years. Meetings are provided by the bill for the first Tuesday in December annually. The powers of the proposed board are made about the same as those of the present board.

PRECINCT ASSESSORS. Representative Barrett, of Grant, Gilliam, Sherman, Wasco and Wheeler counties, has introduced a bill providing for precinct assessors.

PENALTY FOR ABDUCTION. Representative Thompson, of Umatilla county, has introduced a bill to make abduction punishable by a fine not to exceed \$10,000 or imprisonment in the penitentiary for a term not to exceed twenty-five years.

NO MORE FREE LUNCHEONS. This morning Representative Watson, of Multnomah, who is in the restaurant business, has a bill that is designed to kill off free lunches in saloons. The bill, however, is a two-edged sword, as it also seeks to prevent the sale of liquors in hotels, restaurants and boarding-houses. The penalty provided is a fine of from \$50 to \$300, or imprisonment for a term ranging from thirty to ninety days.

EIGHT HOURS A DAY'S WORK. Eight hours shall constitute a day's labor on all public works. This is the

declaration of a labor bill, introduced by Representative Orton. The provisions of the measure are made applicable to work for the state, county, township, school district, municipality or incorporated town.

HIGH SCHOOL FOR BURNS. Geer, of Malheur and Harney counties, wants a high school at Burns, and he has introduced a bill for that purpose. The bill carries an appropriation of \$10,000.
