A generation passed and Mr. Corbett again came up for the same office in 1897. A caucus was beld and the choice fell on John H. Mitchell. There was no possible way to defeat Mr. Mitchell except publicans and a sufficient number of populists and democrats to refuse to take the oath of office and organize the lower bouse. To this thoroughly anarchistic and revolutionary measure Corbett's friends committed themselves. Some eighteen populist members, by the confession of their leader, U'Ren of Clackamas, were bought up like so many sheep. Money flowed like water. The headquarters of the opposition to Mr. Mitchell became a hell of debauchery. The hold-up succeeded and Corbett reaped the usufruct in an appointment by the governor which the United States senate most righteously refused to confirm.


