Understanding of Britain and Germany -Queen's Death Has Brought **Closest Possible Relations**.

NEW YORK, Jan. 29 .- A dispatch to the Tribune from London says: The presentation of the Blue Ribbon of the Garter by King Edward to the Crown Prince of Germany was a fresh proof of the cordiality of the relations between the two royal families. King Edward has opened his reign by emphasizing, in the strongest way, his personal friendship for the German emperor, and this way perhaps necessary, because there was a different feeling not long ago. when William II was not persona grata in royal circles here.

The queen's death has, indeed, brought England and Germany into the closest of his devotion to the queen was needed. in order to justify what is now in the air-a virtual alliance between Germany and England, not only in China, but also in Europe.

Germany is England's most formidable industrial and commercial rival in Europe, but while protecting her own productive interests she is now secured against any hostile demonstrateon against her manufacturers in this market, and "made in Germany" will not longer be a derisive outcry. 
