"We denounce the reign of Victoria as one long act of bloodshed, murder, cruelty and cant, and insist that when its history is truly written and the influence of snobbery, flunkeyism and toadyism is removed, it will be looked back upon as one in which English wealth and power properly passed their zenith and entered upon a rapid and permanent decline-as one in which, despite the material progress made by England in the early and middle part thereof, greater injustice, more cruelty, grosser wrong, were inflicted upon humanity in general, and upon the Irish in particular, than in the reign of any other English monarch."


