

PRESIDENT'S ALTERNATIVE.

He is not likely to "take to the woods," even in the face of the alternative presented to him by his mild, temperate and logical counsellors of the anti-everything persuasion.

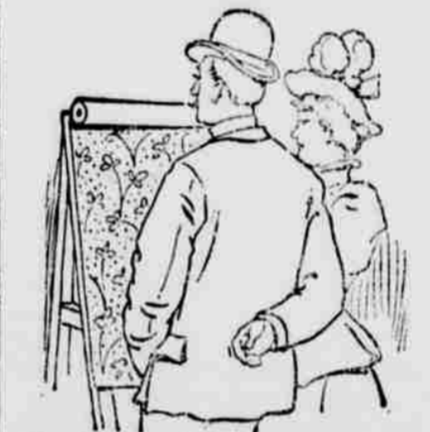
