It is easy to understand why wool is so dull when it is known that there is stored in the United States, awaiting sale, 350,000,000 pounds as against 160,000,000 pounds last year. Of this amount, says the Pacific Farmer, Oregon and Washington have 22,000,000 pounds as compared with 1,500,000 pounds at the same time last year. To add to this there is a great surplusage in the European markets; a report just coming from France is to the effect that the French mills are doing but little in the way of manufacturing, and that many of the leading buyers of wool have failed. Last year wool went up in Paris to over 50 cents per pound, but it is down to less than half that price. All Europe is suffering because there is but little doing in the woolen factories. In the United States cotton has apparently taken the place of wool in many lines of manufactory, and as there is but little demand for woolen goods. of course there is no demand for
