"WRONG" BUT USEFUL.

Protection may be theoretically wrong, says the Bristol, English, Times, but that it is practically useful in its workings is again shown by an official report—this time from our fers to the tin plate industry, and address. the figures quoted are not only interesting, but also significant and disquieting. Down to 1891 the manufacture of tin plate was practically unknown in the states, which used to import about 600 million Falk. pounds a year, nearly all from the from South Wales and the Porest of Dean. In 1891 the McKinley Tariff Act came into force, and the succeeding years have seen a steady and rapid reduction in the quantity of imported tin plates, and a corres ponding increase in the home production. The 600,000,000 pounds sent to America by us in 1892 bas shrunk down to about 100,000,000 pounds, while the tin plates made in the States bave increased from nothing in 1891 to 800,000,000 pounds in 1898. Ten years ago there were no tin plate mills in the States; now surprising, under the circumstances, that our tin plate mills are idle, and that thousands of our tin plate workers are out of work.

Customs receipts are increasing and the treasury has a surplus. Democratic platform writers have no further use for Porto Rico.




