Is Yet in Prison.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 11.—The state department has not been advised of the reported intention of the British government to pardon Mrs. Florence Maybrick, the American woman imprisoned in England on a charge of poisoning her husband. It is said, however, that Mr. Choate has lost no opportunity at all proper times to work toward that end and it is understood that his efforts have been particularly energetic of late. Of course these must be unofficial, for it would not be permissible for the case to be made the subject of formal exchanges.
