WHO OWNS THE \$1500?

Henry "Woodpile" Seem's to be at His old Tricks.

A sensational arrest was made in Albany yesterday. John Gates, assistant janitor at the state house, was arrested on a charge of larceny by bailee of \$1500, and, when apprehended, \$1300 in paper money was found upon his person. Yesterday forenoon Chief of Police Coates received a message from Chief of Police Gibson, of Salem, stating that he had a warrant for the arrest of John Gates, of Woodburn, on a charge of larceny by bailee of \$1500, and asking him to arrest Gates if he should be found on the train. Gates was on the south-bound train arriving at noon, and he was placed under arrest by Chief Coates and Officer McClain. The conductor stated that he got on the train at Marion and tendered a \$100 bill in payment of his fare. He was searched and thirteen new \$100 gold notes were found upon his person enclosed in a legal envelope. The money was taken care of by the officers and Gates was locked up in jail. Gates has been serving as assistant janitor during the session of the legislature.

Chief of Police Gibson, Attorney McMahon and H. L. Gill, of Woodburn, arrived from Salem on the 7 o'clock train. Chief Gibson stated to a Herald reporter that there seemed to be a mystery of some kind about the case. He said that at first Mr. Poorman, the Woodburn banker, told him that \$1500 had been paid to Gates by mistake and that he had run away with it, and that he would swear to a warrant for his arrest; but afterwards H. L. Gill, of Woodburn, swore to the warrant. He said Mr. Poorman told him to arrest the man, get the money from him and then let him skip out.

After the Salem men arrived last night and found that the officers had \$1300 of the money, they tried to induce Chief Gibson to return the money and allow Gates to go, but the Salem officer declared that he had a warrant for Gates and had no authority to let him go, and that he would take him to Salem to answer to the charge.

Gates declined to talk about the case, and those who were instrumental in his arrest also declined to say whose money it was that was stolen or to relate the circumstances. — Albany Herald.

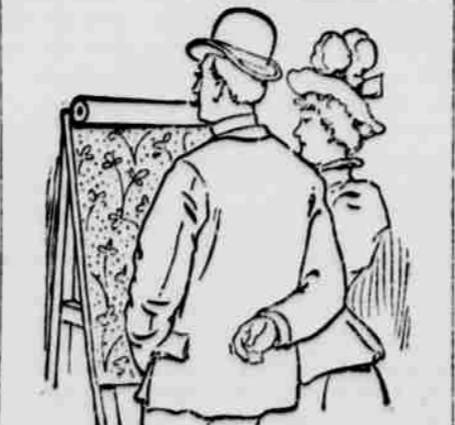
