AN IMPORTANT DISCOVERY.

Dr. C. Winslow, of Boston, vice president of the Egyptian exploration fund, announces the discovery of a most valuable Christian trophy in the form of a fragment of papyrus recently found 140 miles south of Cairo, containing a large part of the first chapter of Matthew's gospel, including the important testimony to the miraculous conception of Christ contained in what appears as the twentieth verse of our English version.

The date of the fragment is placed

by some experts at 150 Anno Domini, and by the editors of the society's publications at fifty or sixty years later. It is therefore the oldest fragment of the gospels in the United States and one of the oldest known fragments in the world. It belongs to the same class of papyrus as the Sinaitic manuscript but is one hundred and fifty to two hundred years older. When the papyrus of which this is a fragment was written, there were probably many persons yet living who had seen and conversed with the last of the apostles.

As a contribution, therefore, to Christian evidences the value of this new discovery lies in the fact that it is an answer, within the lines of its own particular testimony, to those who insist that the doctrine of the miraculous conception, as well as the narratives of the miraculous events and incidents in the life of Christ, was an accretion of a too credulous age more or less remote from the times of the apostles. But the last of the apostles had not passed away till the close of the first century and fifty years from that time was too short a period for such an alleged accretion as the miraculous conception to have gained an unquestioned place, as this fragment proves it did, in the faith and literature of the Christian brotherhood.
