WOOL THIEVES CAPTURED.

Deputy Sheriff Wood Arrested the Thieves at Sherar's Bridge Last Evening.

Sheriff Kelly has succeeded in running down the two thieves who made the daring attempt last Wednesday to get away with three sacks of wool belonging to the Wasco warehouse. The night following the attempted robbery Deputies Sexton and Wood spent on the railroad track between Mosier and Hood River, following what proved to be a blind trail. Two strange men had been seen on the road west of town, headed westward. Two men got breakfast Thursday morning at the McLean camp, near Mosier, but they failed to answer to the description of the wool thieves and the deputies came back to town and started immediately for the regions south.

Two strangers, answering fully to the description of the thieves, had called at the residence of M. J. Anderson, of Dufur, and requested food. After having been given food they went to a store and purchased a quantity of bread. Then they started in the direction of the Canyon City road and were afterwards tracked to the Warner ranch, at the head of Sherar's grade, where all trace of them was for a time lost. Meanwhile Deputy Sheriff Wood had been instructed to proceed to Sherar's Bridge and await developments, as it was evident the men were headed in that direction, while Messrs. Sexton and Anderson scoured the hills this side the bridge.

It was learned that the men had slept a whole day in a vacant house in the Dufur neighborhood, and it was inferred that they made a habit of sleeping in the day time and traveling nights. At Dufur they said they were looking for work in some lambing camp.

Last night as the moon began to shine out bright and clear the two men arrived at Sherar's Bridge and were immediately placed under arrest by Deputy Sheriff Wood. They answer exactly to the description given of them by those who saw them when they were trying to dispose of the wool. They are expected here on this afternoon's stage.
