
House bill 205, which was approved by the governor last Tuesday, requires the collection of a road poll tax of \$3 from every male inhabitant over 21 and under 50 years of age, unless by law exempt. The tax may be paid either in labor or each, but county courts may require that it be paid in cash. If any person refuses to pay the tax a suit may be brought in a justice's court to collect R. & N. The tax must be expended upon the roads of the district in which collected. The act contains an emergency clause, and goes Dailes at 4:45 a. m. into effect immediately. 
