## Force of Gravity Not Always Same.

It has been found that the force of gravity at sea level is not constant at all points on the earth's surface—that is a pound is not literally a pound everywhere. In some recent observations with delicate instruments C. A. Almonetti has found that in 11 towns of Italy the earth's attractive force varied by one part in 10,000. This means that a standard pendulum (39.09 inches in length), which beats seconds, would lose 26 minutes each year by reason of this apparently slight difference in the force of gravity in these towns of Italy. A ton of gold, if weighed on a spring balance, would differ in value by the loss of weight theoretically by \$30 at localities where the gravity was a minimum. The explanation given of these variations of gravity is the uneven massing of the material of the earth's crust.—Little Chronicle.
