Declines to Accept the Amended Canal Treaty-British Reply is Received -No Counter-Proposal Made.

WASHINGTON, March 11.-The long expected answer from the British government to the state department's communication reciting the action of the senate upon the Hay-Pauncefote treaty was returned at noon today. Lord Pauncefote, the British ambassador, had already acquainted Secretary Hay with the fact that he had received a communication from his government on the subject and it had been in his possession for several days. Secretary Hay had acquired a general knowledge of the character of the British response. Lord Panncefore came to the state department at noon by appointment. He brought the answer with him and read it to Secretary Hay. It was in the form of instructions from Lord Lanedowne, the British minister of foreign affairs, to Lord Pauncefote, and he-let a copy of these instructions with Secretary Hay. The secretary and the ambassador were closeted for half an hour. At the conclusion of the conference, it was stated that the instructions to Lord Pauncefote were to notify the government of the United States that the British government did not see its way clear to accept the senate amendments.
