No eight months' period in the history of American export trade shows so large a total of exports as the eight months ending with February, 1901.

The favorable balance of trade, or excess of exports over imports, shows an even greater increase, being \$492,224,904 for the eight months ending with February, against \$364,219,897 in the same months of the preceding fiscal year.
