

PHILIPPINE AND AMERICAN TAGALS.

"This morning," says an associated press dispatch from Manila, dated March 30th, "Aguinaldo was recognized by a crowd of natives going up the river in a lighter. The natives gazed on him a while in silence and then began to cheer, calling him Emilio and vile names in the Tagal language. The guards quieted the disturbance and Aguinaldo left the window in disgust."

"Tonight," says a Boston dispatch of the same date, referring to a meeting at which Edward Atkinson, Robert Treal Paine, Ex-Governor Boutwell, Senor Sixto Lopez, Aguinaldo's ex-secretary, and others were the speakers,—"tonight President McKinley's administration was denounced and Aguinaldo's name loudly applauded by the large audience that listened to the speakers at the anti-imperialist meeting in Faneuil hall."

The Minnesota senate has passed an anti-trust bill which specially exempts the labor trusts from its provisions. And yet it is claimed that laws are made for the benefit of the rich, only, and never for the poor. There is not a law-making body under the American stars that would dare to pass a measure against trusts and exempt from its provisions anything except labor trusts that sometimes do the most arbitrary and tyrannical things in the world.

The Walla Walla Union says: "No wonder settlers are looking for places where they can be safe from the elements, and where they can sit down to supper and know when it clouds up in the west there is no danger of being blown into eternity or being dropped a mangled, suffering mass a mile away in your neighbors front yard."

President McKinley, during his western tour, is expected to spend Sunday in Spokane and the Spokesman-Review suggests that a great, open air, religious service in one of the city parks would be an appropriate feature of Spokane's welcome.

All the legal troubles of the Columbia Southern railroad have been settled and the litigation in the circuit court will be dismissed. By the terms of settlement Drake C. O'Reilly gets par value for his 1147 shares of stock and another matter at issue will be submitted to arbitration.

The first number of the Ashwood Prospector has arrived. The paper is edited by Max Luettmann, of the Antelope Herald, and is devoted to the development of the mining interests of the Trout Creek, Crook county, district.

Andrew Carnegie will give \$100,000 to the city of Portland for a free library building, providing the city will guarantee a site and a sufficient annual income for its maintenance.

The town of Glenelg, Md., is rejoicing in the remarkable fact that its name spells the same backward as forward. Well, what's the matter with Hannah? asks the Kansas City Star.

Goldendale celebrated All Fools' Day by holding a city election in which the issue was whether the town should be dry or wet during the coming year.

Without waiting for any special call, several hundred ministers have applied to President McKinley for appointments as army chaplains.

La Grande has taken preliminary

steps to organize a rod and gun club, whose chief object is the protection of game and fish.

When the late Washington legislature passed its law regulating salmon fishing, some one connected with the engrossing committee was good enough to leave out the section which prohibited Sunday fishing. Fish Warden Van Dusen is, therefore, not a little puzzled how to enforce the Oregon law so long as fishermen are permitted to fish on the Washington side. But the Astoria News comes to the warden's relief and says: "The matter is of little consequence, and it is indeed a fortunate circumstance that the laws of the two states do not agree. The Sunday-closing feature of the Oregon is a delusion, so far as protecting the industry is concerned, and everyone interested in the business will be happy to know that enforcement of the Oregon law will be impracticable." This may intimate how much respect the Astoria fishermen have for the Sunday-closing feature of the fishing laws.
