

THE PROPOSALS FOR SURRENDER

Aguinaldo Offers, Through General MacArthur, to End All Armed Resistance of Filipinos to the United States.

New York, April 3.—A special to the Herald from Washington says: Important proposals relative to the surrender of all the insurgents in the Philippines have been made by Aguinaldo, through General MacArthur, to the United States. The proposals were brought before the cabinet meeting and at its conclusion instructions in reply to them were sent by Secretary Root. The president will not bargain with Aguinaldo, but if the prisoner will use his influence, the United States will welcome his aid, and will consider his conduct when determining the future of prisoner.

Apportionment of School Funds.
