INDEPENDENT LINE TO THE PACIFIC

New Road Is Virtually Assured Through the Passage by the Canadian Government of Two Bills.

TORONTO, April 19.—The government of Canada passed the two bills through the railway committee, which virtually secure a second independent railway to the Pacific coast. The first bill was that promoted by J. J. Hill for connecting his United States railway system with the immense coal fields of British Columbia, where hitherto the Canadian Pacific had no competitor. The main conditions of the charter are no discrimination in coal prices or freight rates, no amalgamation or pooling with other railways in the district, and the government to name maximum freight rates. The government retains control of 15,000 square miles of coal land which it may put on the market at any time, or operate.

The second bill confirms the sale made by President Mellen, of the northern Pacific, of all Manitoba lines to the Canadian Northern, the government retaining the power to name maximum freight rates. The Manitoba government is given power to guarantee the Canadian Northern bonds and to purchase all the Northern Pacific lines if so desire at the end of 30 years.

Big Yachts to Sail Tryout.

NEW YORK, April 19.—Constitution, Columbia and Independence are invited to race on the Sound for a suitable cup, which will be offered by the Indian Harbor Yacht Club.

Frank B. Jones, chairman of the Indian Harbor Club's board of trustees, announced their decision. He said the date of the race and the course to be used had not been settled, and that the former depended on the convenience of the owners of the big 90-footers. It is proposed to have the race sailed about

10 miles above Greenwich, Conn., where depth of water and width of the Sound will give the best possible course. The yachts will sail either a windward and leeward course, or a triangle of about 30 miles, which will give it the aspect of the big international race.

Miss Cleveland's plans.

ROCKLAND, Me., April 19.—Miss Rose E. Cleveland, sister of the former President Cleveland, accompanied by her niece and Mr. and Mrs. George M. Newell, of Boston, have arrived here on their way to Isleboro, where they will make preparations for spending the season. In the early days of the first Cleveland administration, Miss Cleveland was the lady of the White House. Miss Cleveland has had a Summer house built there, and among other guests who will be entertained is former President Cleveland, who plans to make a short visit in about a month.

Killed Himself With Dynamite.

MILTON, Cal., April 19.—John H. Gorham, foreman of the Union copper mine, last night shot and killed George B. McCarthy, a prominent young man of Copperopolis, and then blew himself to pieces with giant powder. Both men were attentive to the same woman, and jealousy is supposed to have been the cause of the tragedy. Gorham placed some dynamite in a box, affixed a fuse and detonator, and sitting down, calmly awaited the explosion. Portions of his anatomy were scattered in every direction.

Putting Coal Out of Business.

SEATTLE, Wash., April 19.—A special to the Times from Nanaimo, B. C., says: United States Consular Agent George L. Schetky, who recently returned from San Francisco, gives a most pessimistic account of the condition of the coal trade there. He says oil is putting coal out of business everywhere except for domestic use. The slightest fluctuation in present coal prices would be fatal to the coal industry. The Market Street Railway, only lately one of the largest coal consumers in San Francisco, is now using oil entirely, as are also the largest sugar refinery and a number of the largest industrial concerns in Oakland. Schetky says oil is so plentiful in Southern California that they are sprinkling the roads with it instead of water.

Arrested For Embezzlement.

PITTSBURG, Pa., April 19.—A. J. Schroth, a bookkeeper in the First National Bank of Birmingham, this city, was arrested late last night by United States Marshal Leonard, charged with embezzlement of \$35,000 of the bank's funds. He was released later on furnishing bail in the sum of \$10,000. The alleged defalcation was discovered by National Bank Examiner Slack. He says the bank is in an excellent condition and will not be affected. It has a capital stock of \$100,000, and undivided profits and surplus of \$206,000.
