STEAD SEES WAR CLOUDS

Predicts Trouble Between England and America-The Trouble, He Thinks, Will Encourage the Boers to Keep Up Their Fight.

LONDON, April 26 .- William T. Stead, in an interview with a representative of the Daily Mail yesterday, said :

"The Boers are calculating upon England's becoming embroiled with Russia. or some other complication. If I am not mistaken, we are on the verge of a storm across the Atlantic that will rudely shatter our peaceful calculations. When the United States congress meets, the Clayton-Bulwer treaty will be torn into shreds and thrown into cur faces. We shall have to choose between fighting and eating humble pie. The first serious discussion of the possibility of such a war will do more to keep the Boers in the field than all the speeches of all the pro-Boers in existence."

\$150,000 For Mrs. Sutro. SAN FRANCISCO, April 25 .- Mrs. Clara Kiuge-Sutra has secured from the representatives of the Adolph Sutro estate a recognition of the claims urged by her and her children, Adolph Sutro, Jr., aged 9, and Adolphine Sutro, aged 7 years. The settlement, which is on the basis, of \$150,000, has been agreed on. The woman claims to have been contract wife of the late millionaire. It is intimated that she may secure the famous Cliff House as her share of the estate. Before his death Sutro executed a deed conveying to these children real estate in this city which was then estimated to be worth \$50,000.
