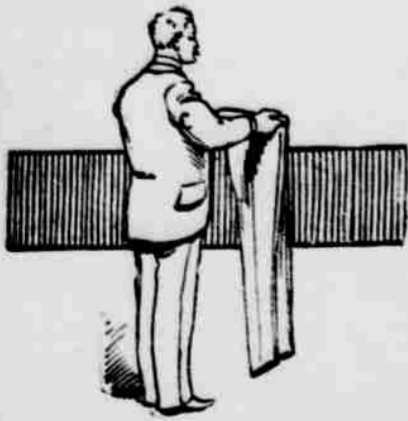

CROOKED WORK SUSPECTED.

Speaking of the failure of the Gilbert Bros. bank, at Salem, the Statesman says:

The worst feature of the whole matter for the managers of the bank is the disclosure that the securities for which the money of the trusting depositors has been paid out are of such a character that their negotiable or collectible value is exceedingly doubtful, and the further disclosure that in a bank where deposits of \$120,000 or more were held, the vaults contained only about \$2,000 in money and none of the valuable paper, such as county and state warrants and the like, of which Gilbert Bros. are known to have purchased a large amount.

There ought to be a way of protecting the depositors of banks from results which are suspected in this case. The general belief is that if some officer or authorized person could have stepped into control of the Gilbert bank last Saturday, at the time the suit was filed in the U. S. court, he could have found a large amount of money and valuable paper which is not now in evidence. Courts should have the power, then, of placing an officer in charge of such institutions immediately upon the filing of sufficient complaint and not give several days in which to "prepare" for an emergency.

A SMART DEMAGOGUE.

The New York Times, in a humorously severe article, thus describes the new mayor of Cleveland. Tom L. Johnson is a professional free trader, yet he made a fortune in the manufacture of protected steel rails. He made another fortune in the street railway business, yet advocates their municipal ownership. He stoutly stood for five-cent fares until he disposed of his holdings, and then posed as the champion of a three-cent rate. His wealth is in securities, and he advocates the single tax, which puts the entire burden on real estate. He has plenty of wealthy backers, yet "plays for the votes of the masses." He is a gold man, yet is a warm personal friend of the champion of free silver, William J. Bryan.

In the recent Cleveland campaign, Johnson "succeeded in bringing to his support the saloon element of Cleveland, without losing strength among the liquor people," according to one of his admiring supporters. Tom appears to be the twentieth-century exemplar of that notable individual, Mr. Facing-Both-Ways, of Pilgrim's Progress. If Lincoln's aphorism is true, he is riding for a fall, for you cannot fool all the people all the time.

Prof. Willis G. Johnson, in the current number of Good Housekeeping, announces that it is possible to distinguish the mosquito that transmits the malaria germ. The dangerous species are called the anopheles and keep their bodies nearly at right angles to the surface upon which

they are resting. The other 249 species of mosquitos are not dangerous, and can be distinguished by the fact that they keep their bodies nearly parallel with what they are resting on. The opposite is true of the anopheles larva which are found in stagnant ponds or slow running water. This much having been discovered, it now remains for our county commissioners to offer a reward for the scalps of the dreaded anopheles, and humanity will take a new interest in the swamps, says the Walla Walla Union.

"The Widow Bedott."

The Oregonian, in speaking of the play that is announced for Friday night week in this city, says:

"The Widow Bedott," compassed around with a number of specialties which make her all the more fascinating, opened a week's engagement at the Metropolitan last night and proved to be the best attraction seen here for several weeks. While the play itself has been sacrificed to a specialty bill, the company are better as vaudeville artists than as actors, and in consequence the comedy has gained by the alterations and cuts in it. In the singing numbers the company is especially good, the songs by Miss Olive Vail being unusually well given. Miss Vail is possessed of a clear, high soprano voice of great range, and she uses it very effectively.

Guy Tully sang a couple of songs which were appreciated, and nearly all the other members of the company contributed to the vocal part of the program, either as soloists or in the excellent concerted numbers.

As the Widow Bedott, Horace Ewing creates considerable amusement, although he is not quite so natural as he might be. Edward Clisbee does a good bit of character acting as Elder Sniffles, David Swim is a good Benjamin Harriman, Clarence Lyndon is acceptable as Fred Harriman, and Guy Tully is a good Tom Follet. Miss Madge Tucker is an enthusiastic Melissa Bedott, Miss Olive Vail is pretty and charming as Daisy Harriman, and Miss Alice Wrenn answers the requirements of the part of Dotty Sniffles. "The Widow Bedott" will be the attraction all the week, with the usual Saturday matinee.

The Wheat Market.

The Portland Commercial Review of this week says: The spot market ruled unusually quiet the past week. There were few buyers in the market and equally as few sellers; the latter being dissatisfied with bids, are not pursuing sales with freedom. Wheat held at principal interior points is in strong hands, and the general opinion there is that wheat will go higher and that the remainder of the season a gradual improvement will be noted. It is true that this opinion is only among holders, but dealers generally are of the opinion that the market at present is too high to do any business with safety. Stocks are very large in Umatilla and Walla Walla counties and in hands of holders, who are well able to carry same over to next season. The prevailing idea is if 50 cents per bushel can be secured in either county for wheat, that some very large parcels will be let go. The weather has continued favorable for the growing crops. In Eastern Oregon and Washington spring work is almost completed, and the acreage of spring grain is the largest on record. Fall wheat is in good condition, is reported to have stood well and as being well rooted. Quotations remain steady at 58@59c for Club; Bluestem, 61@62c per bushel.

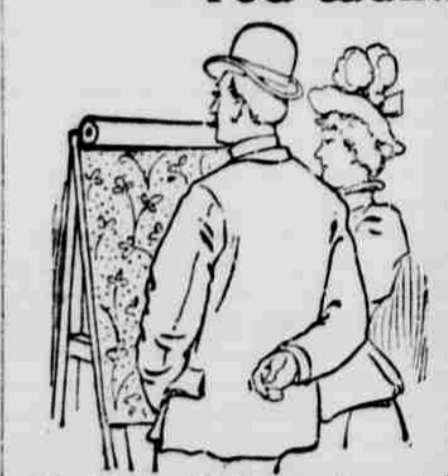
