SAGACITY OF KING EDWARD

Political Effect of the Heir's Visit to Australia—Crown Binds the Empire Together.

NEW YORK, May 10.—A dispatch to the Tribune from London says: The ceremony at Melbourne is the chief theme of the English press, and is discussed with dignity and enthusiasm. Revert is expressed that this new triumph of imperialism has come before peace has been restored in South Africa, but the truth is discerned that the Australian federation was accelerated, if not brought about by the call to arms which inspired loyalty throughout the empire eighteen months ago. The creation of a united parliament for the commonwealth is described by more than one leader writer as the direct result of the excess of emotion and enthusiasm kindled by the war in South Africa.

The sagacity of the king in sending out the heir to the throne on this imperial mission at a time when he would not have been censured for canceling the engagement made by Queen Victoria, is fully recognized, and the moral is enforced that the chief link in binding together the world-wide empire. Imperialism was not considered by the secretary for war when he lost sight of the auxiliary forces of the colonies in formulating a scheme for the reorganization of the army, and the chancellor of the exchequer forgot the colonies when he proposed an independent change in customs and the finance systems without special concessions to their interest and welfare. It is the king, by forethought, in dignifying the Australian parliament, who has shown himself an astute imperialist and imparted increased impetus to the movement for imperial federation in a stagnant and depressing period when the nation was without enthusiasm for any great cause, and waiting wearily for the end of an inglorious war.

Americans to Leave Peking.

PEKING, May 10.—The Americans have evacuated the districts under their control, with the exception of the Forbidden City, which they will continue to occupy in spite of foreign objections, unless orders to the contrary are received from Washington. As it would be impossible to turn over the American districts to the Chinese, who certainly would not be allowed to keep them independently, General Chaffee, in order to prevent chaos, notified Count von Walderssee, a week ago, that he would evacuate today. Those portions adjoining the British districts were assigned to them, and the remaining portions were assigned to the Germans.

Irish Paper Suppressed.

DUBLIN, May 10.—The police of Cork, Limerick and other towns of Ireland seized all the copies of William O'Brien's weekly paper, the Irish People, found at the newsdealers today. The offending articles, it now appears, were abusive attacks on King Edward, Cardinal Vaughan and the address to the king, which, the paper declares, was such as might have been presented to a Legree half a century ago. The article find consolidation in the fact that the presentees were English Catholics, "who are repudiated by the only really Catholic nation now in existence. The loyalists represented England only and if the English Catholics choose to acknowledge themselves superstitious idolaters is no fault of ours."

Primary Election Bill Vetoed.

MADISON, Wis., May 10.—Governor LaFollette today sent a long message to the senate vetoing the Hagemeyer primary election bill. The bill was an amendment to the Stevens measure and provided for the operation of the law in so far as county elections were concerned. This, the governor says, is contrary to the law, which provided for the election of all candidates by direct vote.

ARE READY TO ACCEPT

Cuban Convention Will Adopt the Platt Amendment — Members Reconvened at Havana This Morning.

NEW YORK, May 10.—A dispatch to the Tribune from Havana says the constitutional convention will reconvene Friday morning to discuss the report of the Washington commission. Members who were absent in different parts of the island have returned, and there will be a full attendance. Some members favor accepting the report, and then passing a resolution to accept the Platt amendment as understood in the light of that report. Sentiment seems to favor early action, but some discussion is inevitable and a few of the radical members will criticize acceptance but will not seriously oppose it.

Twenty-one members are now counted on to support the amendment, but are not fully agreed among themselves regarding the form in which the convention shall express its position. A majority want to go forward and adopt an electoral law so that the elections may be held in October.

The Platt Amendment.

HAVANA, May 9.—There now seems to be no doubt that the Cuban constitutional convention will accept the Platt amendment, but it is expected that there will be some delay before a final vote is reached. Senator Juan Gualberto Gomez is advocating public sessions. It is stated that the colored orator wishes to make some interesting statements to the public before the convention dissolves. It was in the plans to hold a meeting today, but owing to delay in printing the report of the special commission which went to Washington, the session was postponed until tomorrow.

Platt amendment.

The democrats have nominated Senor Carlos Garcia as their candidate for mayor, the republicans have nominated Senor Estrada Mora, and the nationalists will nominate the incumbent, Senor Gener.

Our Fair Indorsed.

DENVER, Colo., May 10.—The annual convention of the American Federation of Musicians met in this city today and its sessions will continue until the middle of next week. Nearly 100 delegates are in attendance.

Little was done today except the appointment of committees. Resolutions were adopted indorsing the Lewis and Clark celebration at Portland, Or., in 1905, and in favor of holding the meeting of the federation for that year there.

A Cuban Fears Annexation.

NEW YORK, May 10.—A dispatch to the Herald from Havana says: Senor Villendas, who voted against the Platt amendment, has written an open letter saying that he will accept the amendment because he fears the annexation of Cuba.
