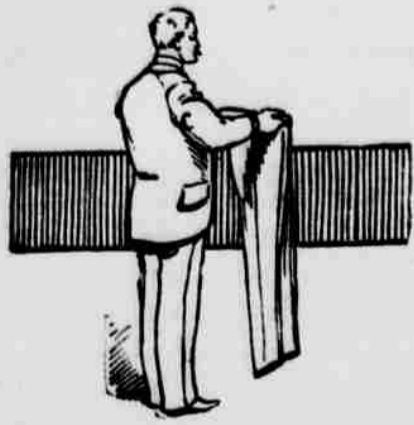

NICKEL-IN-THE-SLOT MACHINES

Speaking of the nickel-in-the-slot-machines, the Spokesman-Review says:

These machines are the most objectionable gambling devices that the ingenuity of man has yet invented. They drain their victims of their earnings, and they drain the community of a great deal of money, as all of them are operated on "royalty," and a fixed percentage must be sent away weekly or monthly to the distant manufacturer.

Hundreds of youths who would not play at faro or roulette in the big gambling halls, became fiercely addicted to the gambling habit from playing at the machines.

An impression is conveyed by the name of the device that it is a mild form of gambling. This is a mistake. A nickel seems a small matter, but the machines have a number of slots, the players are tempted with the possibility of winning a number of prizes, and many risk from 10 to 25 cents at every turn of the wheel. As only a few seconds are required to drop in the nickels, press the bar and determine the result of the hazard, it is easy to lose 50 cents within a minute. Many young men, when the wheels were running, lost their week's earnings within an hour or less.

These machines are particularly pernicious because they sit in public places which young men—many of them minors—may frequent and not lose social standing or excite the alarm of parents or employers. They are recruiting stations for the big public gambling halls. They are unlawful, and should not be tolerated.

The gold fund in the United States treasury amounts to the enormous sum of \$561,469,468, as against considerably less than a million six or seven years ago when the free silver agitation was at its height and the government, in order to maintain the gold fund at the lowest permissible figure, was obliged to buy gold in open market by the sale of \$262,000,000 of United States bonds at a rate of interest nearly double the market value of such bonds today. No sooner had the free silver nightmare vanished by the restoration to power of a party pledged to maintain the gold standard than the gold fund increased by leaps and bounds till the United States treasury contains more gold than any similar institution in the world. This astounding fact, astounding, that is to say, because of the suddenness of its accomplishment, proves to an absolute demonstration two things: The wisdom of the men who were instrumental in saving the nation from the fell curse of a debased currency, and the fact that the business interests of the country are enjoying an unparalleled degree of prosperity.

NOTICE TO WATER-CONSUMERS.

All persons using Dalles City water for irrigating purposes between the 1st day of May and the 1st day of September, will observe the following rules and regulations:

Persons will be permitted to use the water below the bluff on all even days, and above the bluff on all odd days, from 6 o'clock a. m. until 8 a. m., and from 6 o'clock p. m. until 8 p. m.

The above rules must be strictly complied with, and any infraction of the above rules will subject the offender to a fine of \$1, and the water will be shut off until paid; and for a second offence double the amount.

The following charges will be made: For one full lot 50x100, \$1.50 per month. Each additional lot \$1.25; half lot 75 cts.

All persons using water in closet or toilet will see to it that the water is shut off when not in use, or water will be shut off altogether if allowed to run to waste.

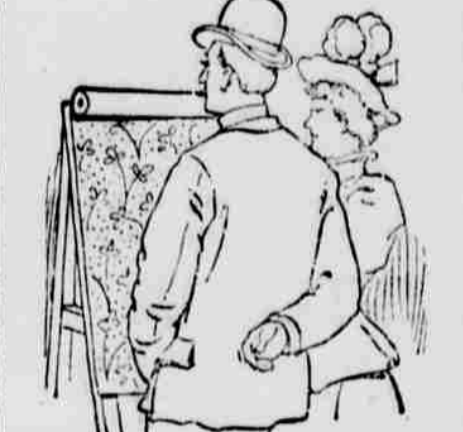
