## TO START SATURDAY

Homeward Journey of Presidential Party—Mrs. McKinley is Gaining Strength Rapidly.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 22.—Mrs. McKinley's condition has improved so rapidly that official announcement has been made that the president expects to start for Washington Saturday.

This morning President McKinley remained at home attending to official business. In the afternoon he was the guest of California Commandery, Knights Templar, at a drill and reception given in his honor in the Mechanics' Pavilion. All the previously announced plans of the Templars were carried out, with the exception that the president did not ride in the parade.

Tonight President McKinley will be present at the Mechanics' Pavilion during the competitive drill of the League of the Cross cadets for a medal awarded by Archbishop Riordan to the company making the best showing.

This afternoon there will be a reception by the Century Club to the Cabinet ladies.

Secretary Hay has abandoned his idea of returning to Washington immediately. It has been definitely decided that all members of the cabinet shall remain here until the departure of the president. Meanwhile, official business will be transacted in the same manner as though the members of the presidential family were at their desks in Washington.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 22.—At 1 o'clock Secretary Cortelyou gave out the following:

"Mrs. McKinley's physicians report that she is now convalescent and is daily gaining strength."

The foregoing is probably the last regular bulletin to be issued by Secretary Cortelyou. He stated this morning that she had a very good night and was sitting up today.

It has been definitely decided that the president and his party will leave here Saturday next. They will go directly to Washington and no stops will be made except those made necessary by railroad arrangements.

### Largest Battleship in the World.

NEW YORK, May 22.—If the report heard at the navy department proves correct, says a Times special from Washington, and congress approves the recommendations of Rear-Admiral Bowles and the construction board, the United States may have a battleship of 16,000 tons displacement, with corresponding armament, thus providing a warship of formidable proportions. The largest battleship now owned by any naval power is of a little more than 15,000 displacement. It is related that the largest one present at the funeral demonstration in honor of Queen Victoria was a Japanese battleship recently completed, and displacing 15,000 tons. Great Britain has several battleships of equal tonnage on the ways. Italy's Lepanto, of 15,900 tons, has for several years been the largest battleship in the world.

The British and Japanese battleships of 15,000 tons draw 27 feet of water or more. That would prevent their entry into many of our harbors, and the fact that many American harbors cannot afford water for vessels of such draught has led to the construction of battleships drawing the least water, consistent with stability. The mean draught of the Maine class will be less than 24 feet. The idea is to produce a vessel that will not draw much more with the displacement of 16,000 tons.

Some members of the construction board hope to secure designs promising a speed of 21 knots, which, if obtained, would make the new battleship equal in speed and superior in power to most of the armored cruisers now afloat, and make her a formidable antagonist of the most powerful battleships yet built.

## THE EVIL HAS INCREASED

Effect of Abolition of Army Canteen on Intemperance—Testimony of Officers and Men is Unanimous.

NEW YORK, May 22.—The Times says: General Brooke has sent an order to all commandants of posts in the department of the East to send to him September 1st a complete report of the results which have ensued on the abolition of the army canteen. Officers say that these reports will show beyond cavil that intemperance has largely increased under the new regime, and it is predicted that the next congress will give serious consideration to the real situation as it has developed.

Seven privates, absent without leave from Fort Ethan Allen, Vt., have just been locked up in the military prison at governor's island, which is the headquarters of the department. They disappeared from their post immediately after payday of this month, and their troubles are attributed by officers to the abolition of canteens.

A reporter interviewed a number of officers at Governor's island, and every one of them was saying, "I told you so," when the cases of Fort Sheridan, Fort Snelling and Fort Ethan Allen were called to mind. The officers there regard it but a matter of a short time when the public sentiment of the nation will demand the re-establishment of the canteen.

Captain Akams, who was acting adjutant at Governor's island in General Sheridan's absence, said that since payday there had been unusual trouble in nearly every post in the department, and he understands in other departments also. He understands that the number of men arrested has been larger than usual, and there has been a noticeable number arrested for intoxication. He was not prepared to say just what the percentage of increase is.

### Tramps Numerous.

SALEM, May 22.—Railroad men report tramps becoming seriously obnoxious along the line of the Southern Pacific south of here. At Marion Station yesterday afternoon, when the overland was coming through, the brakeman discovered one of those festive tourists and ejected him from the train, whereupon the tramp drew a revolver and threatened to bore an oil-well through him. The crowd began to move toward them, and the tramp fled. Five of those gentry broke into a boxcar at Albany on Monday evening and stold a lot of perfumery and other stuff.
