Prices con-
tinue in favor of the bayer, except on ine woole, which are firmily he!d in view the atrength shown in the conntry the London eales. The excitement in the Weat has abated. Two of the largeat dealers in the market have bought no wools in the Weat, believing that the prices which have been paid there are
not warranted. Not only $25,000,000$ ounds of new wools thus far this year ave been bought ont there, and connew woole can be bought at more favorable prices later on-at any rate, they are willing to tase their chances of eceuring wools later at as favorable terms
as are now quoted. Sales for the week at Bonton amonnted pounds foreign, making a total of 2,290 , 000 pounde, againat a total of $1,150,000$ pounde for the corresponding period lant year. The sales since January 1st

Eastern firm of between 10,000 and 12, 000 head of yearlinge and 2 -year-olde. All of this stock is intended for the
Eastern market, and will not be driven to the Montana or Wyoming range for fattening. It is in condition at the present time. Yearlinge are purchased
by these buyers for $\$ 20$, and 2 -year-olds by these buyers for $\$ 27$. This price is one dollar cheaper has the eame atock sold for at the same
period last year. The aale will clean most of the surplus beef in that section of the country, and will leave but few from the mmediate district for the Fall market. Buyere are quite active in Malheur and Harney counties, and offer lempting prices.
