

CUBANS MAY REPENT

Administration Hopeful That It Will Accept the Amendment — Instructions Sent to Wood.

WASHINGTON, June 7.—The cabinet was in session over two hours today discussing the Cuban and Philippine situations. A communication has been received from Governor-General Wood in regard to the prospect for the unconditional acceptance of the Platt amendment, but its contents are not made public. It can be stated, however, that there is a hopeful feeling in administrative circles that after the first soreness wears off the convention will see the wisdom of accepting the terms of the amendment. The answer to General Wood to be sent and the language of the communication was under consideration today. Meanwhile the status in Cuba is to be maintained. No action looking to the calling of another convention is contemplated if the present convention should decline to accede to our terms.

The programme looking to the establishment of civil government in the Philippines is being formulated in the shape of an order which is to be promulgated shortly. It is said that there is no definite conclusion as to whether the powers of the civil administration will be exercised under the general war powers of the president or the power vested in him by the Spooner amendment. That, however, is considered a matter of detail. The main point is that the civil administration, which will be confined largely to the municipalities, will be vested in the head of the Taft commission and such other officials as may be designated, and that they will exercise their functions subject to the direct authority of the secretary of war, to whom all reports will be made. Civil administration under military supervision, such as is contemplated, is said not to be anomalous, and the civil government in New Mexico and the Southern States during the early stages of the reconstruction period are pointed to as being substantially analogous to what is proposed in the Philippines.

No Change in Condition.

WASHINGTON, June 7.—Mrs. McKinley's physicians were in consultation over an hour this forenoon and at 11:45 o'clock the following statement was issued: "Mrs. McKinley's physicians state that her condition is about the same as reported yesterday. There has been no material change in the past twenty-four hours."

The examination of Mrs. McKinley's blood, which has been made under the direction of attending physicians, showed negative results, there being no evidence of blood poisoning. This is only one of the various examinations that are being made by the physicians to determine the character of the illness of Mrs. McKinley. The blood was taken from her arm last Tuesday.

Dictator of Philippines Talking Peace.

MANILA, June 7.—Gen. MacArthur today received a document from Gen. Cailles, the Filipino general who proclaimed himself dictator after Aguinaldo's surrender, proposing terms of peace. The document was brought here by Senor Doucel who has been in Legun province for some days trying to induce Cailles to surrender. Just what terms the insurgent leader proposes cannot be learned.

TO PURCHASE MORE HORSES

British Troops Will Receive Fresh Mounts—Officers Accused of Pocketing the Money Sent to Buy Equines.

LONDON, June 6.—After a long and somewhat embittered discussion of the policy of the war office in buying horses for use in South Africa, the house of commons tonight voted the sum of £15,779,000 for transports and remounts.

Sir Biunden Maple, conservative, asserted that the British officers who had been sent to Hungary and Austria had purchased broken down animals at extravagant prices and divided with the price charged the British government above the actual cost. He demanded the appointment of a committee of inquiry. Lord Stanley financial secretary of the foreign office, said inquiry would be made.

Mr. Broderick, war secretary, said the war office paid for horses in England £42, in Canada £30, and in Australia, while in the United States and Hungary the price was £20 to £25.

Americans to Assist.

NEW YORK, June 7.—A dispatch to the Tribune from London says: It is rumored that the delegates of the National Chamber of Commerce will make a large subscription to the Queen Victoria memorial fund before they leave London. The enterprise needs an impetus which would be imported by foreign sympathy, for interest in it is lagging here owing to criticism which the general scheme of the memorial has excited on its artistic side. The American delegates have been discussing the expediency of forming a committee for helping on the work and converting some portion of it into a distinctive American memorial.

Lock and Key to Peking's Sacred City.

NEW YORK, June 7.—According to a Washington dispatch, the National Museum, at that city, will soon place on exhibition the lock and key to the front gate of the Sacred City in Peking. The gate is immediately in front of the imperial residence. The Chinese inscription on the lock will be translated. The lock is an iron cylinder, 3 feet and 10 inches long. Extending from the

cylinder is an iron rod, bent back that it might pass through the gate hasp and into the lock guide. In the lock are four tumblers. The key is of iron and is about four feet long. The lock and key were sent through Minister Conger as a gift to the National Museum by the Rev. W. T. Hobart, a Methodist missionary in China.

"Poet of Freedom."

NEW YORK, June 7.—William Orland Bourne, who was known as the "Pioneer of Unconditional Abolition," is dead at the home of his daughter in Montclair, N. J., aged 82 years. During the Civil War Mr. Bourne was an ardent Unionist, and his songs and poems won for him the title of "Poet of Freedom." He was one of the early promoters of the republican party, and was an intimate friend of Horace Greeley.
