## TRIED TO POISON HER HUSBAND

Pretty Stella Worekz Was Forced Into a Distasteful Marriage and Attempted to Kill Her Lord.

TACOMA, June 10.—Deputy sheriffs are scouring the eastern part of Pierce county hunting for Stella Burgis, an 18-year-old girl, who made two attempts to poison her husband, John Burgis two days after they were married. The second attempt came near proving fatal to Burgis, he swallowing a glassful of wine she gave him which contained a quantity of carbolic acid.

Within the past few days the deputy sheriffs have unearthed facts which prove that Worekz, the girl's father, who is a prominent man of Wilkeson, a little town 20 miles from Tacoma, sold his daughter to Burgis for \$300. She had a strong antipathy for Burgis, but despite her feelings, was compelled to marry him. She made but little outspoken objection when she found her fate was infallibly sealed, but in her heart determined she would not be the wife of the man, a tender regard she had for another person strongly intensifying her antipathy for Burgis. The elation of the marriage, with the feasting and celebration cost Burgis \$600. Such a marriage had never before been seen in Wilkeson.

This, however, failed to reconcile the girl-wife to her husband, and ten days ago, just two days after they were married, she offered Burgis a glass of wine, playfully requesting him to drink it at a single draught. He took a mouthful, but it was so strong that he instantly spat it out and refused to drink more, but still did not suspect his wife of treachery. The same afternoon she brought him another glass. This he drank, and almost immediately the poison began its deadly work. A physician was instantly summoned, and after hard work, saved the man's life. The girl's father relented when he saw to what lengths the marriage had urged his daughter, and subsequently used every effort to assist the girl well out of the reach of the officers who are searching for her.

Since the real facts have been learned in Wilkeson, sympathy has drifted toward the young woman, and prominent citizens there express themselves sorry that the attempt was not more successful and did not include the entire family, with her father, whose avaricious greed placed her in the extremities in which she found herself.

### Exciting Battle With Wildman.

TACOMA, June 10.—Yesterday afternoon the police were called to arrest a supposed burglar on A street. When they arrived they found the man had entered a house by a rear window. The officers followed, and when the stranger saw them approach he seized a board and pounded it to splinters over their heads. Reinforcements were sent for. Chief Fackler being left alone, the man sprang at him with a hammer, but the latter dodged, and Sergeant McCoy, who had just entered, wrenched the hammer from his hand.

A desperate fight to put handcuffs on the man followed. He was endowed with unusual strength, and snarled and growled at the officers attempting to overpower him. One of the man's arms had fallen free, and a handcuff was snapped on the wrist. The other arm was doubled under his breast on the floor, and in spite of the efforts of half a dozen men he could not be made to give up. Finally, Sergeant McCoy managed to wrench the arm out and the other cuff was fastened to his wrist.

When taken to the station it was discovered that the stranger was a wild man who had been on exhibition here and who had been locked out of his house.

## BOER WAR BEFORE ARBITRATION COURT

Dutch Queen Secures the Assistance of the German Kaiser in Behalf of the Boers.

BERLIN, June 10.—The Klein Journal today prints a dispatch from The Hague, saying that Queen Wilhelmina's recent visit here was meant to obtain Emperor William's assistance to end the South African war, both the Zwiand and the Dreihund being willing to do so through The Hague arbitration court, and that the emperor consented, and the court began work thereon. The dispatch has created a sensation here.

The Associated Press has just obtained the following statement from the foreign office, which is authorized by Count von Bulow, the imperial chancellor:

"Neither Great Britain, France nor Russia approached Germany to participate in any action aiming at ending the South African war. Germany has all along distinguished between offering her good offices and intervention. To render her good offices would be possible if both parties to the war requested it, but it will be remembered that Great Britain only joined The Hague conference on condition that the Boer states were excluded. There is no doubt that Mr. Kruger, who is a serious statesman, came to Europe to obtain the good offices of several of the powers to end the war; but there is also no doubt that Great Britain does not want their good offices. At least it is true that since the South African war began Great Britain has never, either verbally or in writing, confidentially or officially, broached such an idea.

"It is quite possible that the Boer side has now formally asked The Hague arbitration court to lend its aid to end the war somehow, and that the court has held a session regarding the matter; but that of course, is entirely different from any serious steps to end the war."

LONDON, June 10.—The Sun hears that Mrs. Botha starts Wednesday for The Hague, where Mr. Kruger has been summoned to attend a conference of the Boer agents in Europe and the United States to consider the report Mrs. Botha

has brought from her husband, in which he advises Mr. Kruger, as the constitutional head of the Transvaal, to sue for peace and the best terms obtainable.

THE HAGUE, June 10.—Mr. Kruger and Dr. Leyds arrived here today. They drove from the railroad station at Hilversum Junction in a closed carriage, and are staying at the residence of Mr. Wolmerans, one of the Boer peace envoys.

SALEM, June 10.—Considerable stir has been created by a charge made by some prominent society ladies of Salem, who visited the Marion county poor farm recently, that the inmates of that institution are miserably kept and fed; that they are in rags and not clean; that no reading matter is provided, and that fresh meat is served for them only once a month. The man who conducts the farm gets about \$9 a month for each inmate. There will probably be an investigation by the county court.
