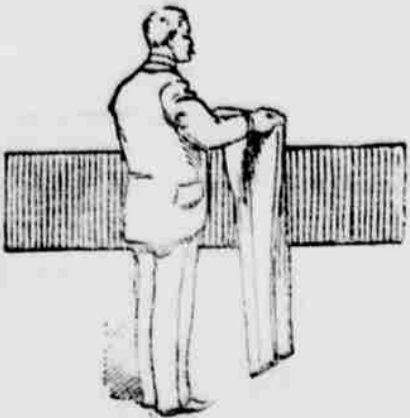

**SCHWAB'S BIG SALARY.**

If J. Pierpont Morgan has been quoted correctly, Charles Schwab, the president of the billion dollar steel trust, does not receive a million dollars a year and in fact gets no more than the ordinary railway president. The story goes that when Schwab was in the employ of the Carnegie company, as one of the highest officers, he received several offers from Germans to leave the Pittsburg company and take hold of foreign steel plants. He declined, however, to leave the company which had taught him all he knew about the steel business. Finally Mr. Carnegie heard of the offers made to Schwab and decided to repay him for his loyalty.

One day he called Mr. Schwab into his office and told him what he had heard. Schwab admitted it to be a fact, and thereupon Mr. Carnegie drew up a contract agreeing to pay Schwab a million dollars each year for five years. When the combination of the big steel industries was talked of Schwab had a conference with Morgan, and Morgan unhesitatingly said that a million a year was more than a company could afford to pay one man as a salary. Schwab agreed with him and pulled the Carnegie contract from his pocket and showed it to Mr. Morgan. It had run for two years and Schwab had only drawn \$200,000 of his money. He took it back from Mr. Morgan and tore it into little bits, saying his salary did not now stand in the way of the consolidation.

Morgan afterwards related the circumstances to Carnegie, who promptly sent a check to Schwab for the \$4,800,000 still due on the salary contract. That, it is said, is the basis upon which the president of the great steel company gets his salary of \$1,000,000 a year.

A former governor, a Catholic priest and a lawyer formed the awarding bench of judges at the oratorical contest in the state university at Eugene last Thursday. Another evidence of the cosmopolitan character of the American people, says the Salem Statesman. And the Statesman offers to wager a bottle of soda water that neither the governor nor the lawyer can pronounce the priest's name when they see it in print, or spell it when they hear it pronounced. It was Father Przybylski, the pastor at Eugene.

One of the numerous excellencies of the demo-pop, sixteen-to-one, free silver currency is finely illustrated by the following extract from the letter of a Honduras correspondent of the Boston Herald. The correspondent writes: "Having occasion to use some money in the interior, I went to the local banker and, taking a single United States bill from my vest pocket to purchase the same, was asked, 'Is your mule at the door?' My reply was, 'He is

ready.' And for the single bill, weighing less than one-quarter of an ounce, I was obliged to load the mule with one hundred and fifty pounds of silver money and transport it some ninety miles into the interior. Surely the sixteen-to-one doctrine is soon knocked out of even the most rabid silver man after a short experience in this country, and you can't get rid of the burden, as the entire business is carried on with this silver currency."

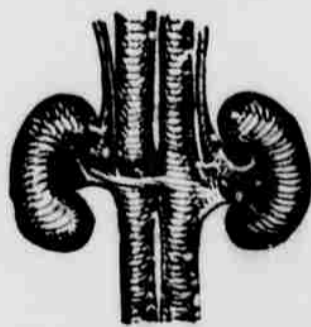

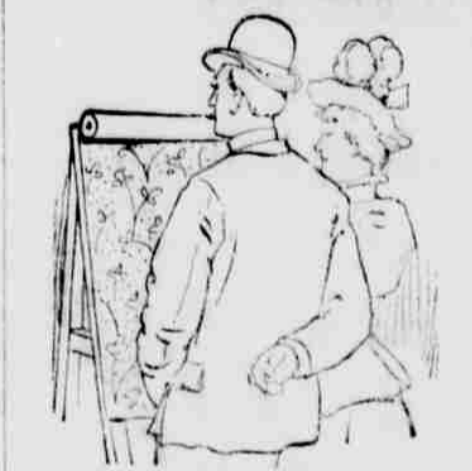
