Meredith was murdered by John Constdine, assisted by Tom Considers, by being struck on the head with a revolver, fracturing the skull in two places, by Tom Considine, and being shot in the body three times by John Considine, body three times by John Considine, either gunshor wound being sufficient to cause the death of the said W. L. Mered. the same taking place at Guy's drug store, June 25, 1901."
