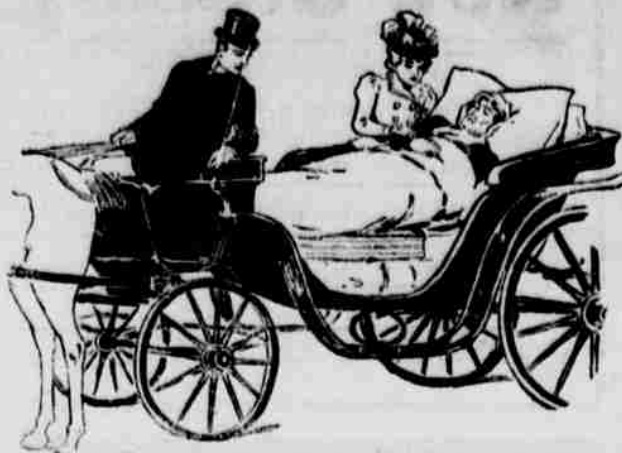

Marked Chinooks Caught.

The young salmon which Fish Commissioner McGuire marked before turning out four years ago, by cutting off the adipose fin, continue to be heard from, and did fair to throw more light on the time required by chinook salmon to attain their growth than anything else has done so far, says the Oregonian. Last year quite a number of these marked fish were caught in the Columbia, having an average weight of 24 pounds. A few days ago Seufert Bros., of The Dalles, reported catching one of these marked fish weighing 50 pounds, and a few days ago one was turned in at Pillar Rock cannery which weighed 40 pounds. From this it is seen that in three years the chinook salmon grows to a weight of 24 pounds, and in four years attains a weight of from 40 to 50 pounds. Perhaps some of the marked fish may be caught next year by which time they will probably have attained their growth, but the big ones of 70 pounds and upwards are doubtless more than five years old. A report was sent out to the effect that a number of the marked chinook salmon had been found among the fish brought there from the Sacramento river, but Columbia river fishermen generally did not believe this. They looked upon it as a fake story intended to show that the chinook salmon hatched on the Columbia found their way to the Sacramento, and that therefore the salmon of the Sacramento were the same as the chinook of the Columbia, which is not generally supposed to be the case.

Death of Sheriff Looney.

BAKER CITY, June 28.—At the St. Elizabeth hospital in this city Sheriff J. D. Looney of Malheur county died last evening. He was brought here three weeks past for an operation for abscess on the spleen. The operation was performed and he failed to rally. Two years ago Sheriff Looney was operated on for the same trouble and gained temporary relief, but his ailment returned.

He was one of the prominent officials of Eastern Oregon, as he bore a splendid name for clean, honest administration of public trust, and progressive business. He has been instrumental in much of the reclamation work for the arid lands of Malheur county, is a prominent stock grower and, although only 34 years of age, has made a career quite enviable. He was serving his second term as the sheriff of Malheur county at the time of his death. The body will be shipped from this place to Ontario, the family home, this evening.
