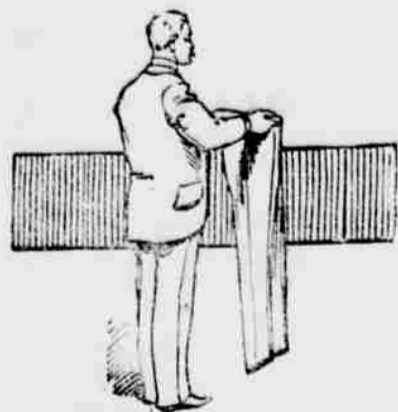

He emassed a competency. He was long on dollars, but short on amusements and happiness. He has gone over the divide. He had no pockets in his shroud and consequently took no money with him. Would it not have been better if he had allowed himself a little time for recreation? Would it not have been a good scheme for him to have gone to the coast or mountains for a week's vacation once or twice each summer? While we should be diligent in business we do not believe that we should be slaves to it. We shall be a long time dead, and would better extract some pleasure out of life from day to day. 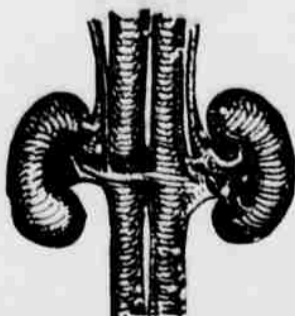

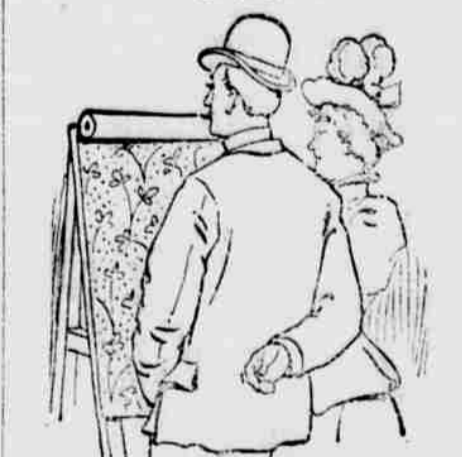
